

SPRING & NATURAL HISTORY AT NEW HARMONY

WHEN: April 26 -28 (2026)

WHAT / WHO: a multi-day symposium focusing on the Wabash Valley, past and present – the flora (esp. canebrakes & sedges), geology, birds and the significance of the Boatload of Knowledge. We also will continue the discussion on the plight of natural history training – where do we go from here? **More story time, too** (people, places and things). Further, given the special locale, there will be some interesting intown activities. New Harmony is a veritable natural history and cultural shrine – 2026 marks the 200th anniversary of the second utopian experiment there which, although failed, left an exceptional and far-reaching legacy. Additionally, we will use the New Harmony symposium to recall and honor the remarkable pioneering work of Jack White and his Illinois Natural Areas Inventory associates which include seminal players in the preservation movement.

This very special gathering, essentially an escape, will consist of stimulating presentations as well as field trip options, featuring a truly exceptional group of speakers and leaders.
